I would like to tell you about my trip to Gulf Wars and my stay with the Barony of Seleone. As many of you know, our barony collected garb and money, and filled Christmas stockings for the children and for pets.

Well, these folks welcomed me with love and kindness and cared for me like I was someone very precious. I stayed in a "Tudor" cottage with a real bed. I was fed every meal and not allowed to pay; I was escorted everywhere and just generally fussed over. I must admitted I loved it.

At least eight people came up to me and showed me that they were wearing garb that we had given to Seleone. (One of the dresses was so pretty that I sort of wished I had swiped it for me!)

Over and over people told me that our barony had given them hope and the Courage to dig out of the Katrina mess. There were tears in their eyes as they told me this- and many hugs. I just lapped it up. They also said that other people had promised stuff, but WE did it!

Just as I was about to leave for home, the barony held court where Price and I were made honorary members of the Barony of Seleone. That, of course, was tearful all around. Even the herald cried.

I am very grateful for this experience but couldn't have had it without all the work this barony did to make it possible. Over and over I was told that others promised, but WE delivered.

Other Things Of Note

This Month is History- Compiled from *Today in History*, by the History Channel.

- April 1, 1572 Dutch rebels seize the strategic port of Brielle, in Holland, touching off a successful revolt against Spanish rule.
- April 2, 742 Birth of Charlemagne, First Holy Roman emperor (800-814)
- April 3, 1559 France, England, and Spain sign the Treaty of Cateau-Cambresis, ending 60 years of war
- April 4, 1284 Alfonso X, Spanish king and astronomer, dies at age 62. He tabulated the movements of the planets, and concluded long before Copernicus that the Ptolemaic model was too complicated
- April 6, 1199 English king Richard the Lion Heart is killed by an arrow at the siege of the castle of Chalus, near Limoges, France
- April 7, 1348 Holy Roman emperor Charles IV establishes Charles University in Prague- the oldest university in Central Europe
- April 8, 1546 The Council of Trent accepts the Latin Vulgate as the official Catholic Bible
- April 12, 1204 In the Fourth Crusade, Venetian and French Crusaders storm and sack Constantinople, which had not been conquered in 900 years
- April 13, 1534 Roman Catholics Thomas More and John Fisher jointly refuse to recognize England's Henry VIII's repudiation of papal authority over the English church. Both were later beheaded
- April 14, 1482 Giovanni Di Fidanza, a leading medieval theologian and minister general of the Franciscan order, is canonized as Saint Bonaventure
- April 15, 1452 Birth of Leonardo Da Vinci, Italian artist and inventor
- April 16, 1521 Martin Luther, excommunicated by the pope for heresy and summoned to appear before the imperial Diet, is greeted triumphantly by supporters as he arrives in Worms

- April 27, 1521 After traveling ¾ of the way around the world, Portugal's Ferdinand Magellan is killed by a tribal poison arrow in the Philippines
- April 29, 1429 Joan of Arc, 17, breaks the English siege of Orleans during the Hundred Year's War

From Rose Marian's Recipe Box: Asparagus in a Sauce Greetings!

It's Spring!!! My favorite time of year! (Despite the blessing of 14" of snow right after the Vernal Equinox. Nature definitely has a sense of humor.)

Spring means asparagus is in season. In his "On Right Pleasure and Good Health", Platina lists the following virtues for asparagus: "Eaten in the first course, asparagus combats flatulence of the stomach, brings clearness of the eyes, gently softens the bowels, and is good for pains of the chest and spine and for ills of the intestines. Some cook it adding wine because it is more effective that way. If its use should be excessive, it would be harmful in no small way, for it sends the urine out swiftly and makes the bladder sore, which is dangerous. When the root of asparagus is ground and drunk in white wine, it gets rid of stones. Some really believe that when its juice is given with wine it is useful against poisons."

Since its so good for health, this month I'm presenting a redaction of a Spanish recipe translated by the late Rudolf Grewe from a collection he published in 1979 called "Libre de sent sovi" (Receptari de cuina), Barcelona (Barcino) which includes 220 recipes from 1324. This translation of Mr. Grewe's was found in "The Art of Cookery in the Middle Ages" by Terence Scully.(1995. Woodbridge, Suffolk, UK: The Boydell Press. 276 pp.)

Here is Mr. Grewe's translation, as given by Mr. Scully: "If you wish to prepare asparagus in sauce, you do thus: get the tender part of asparagus and boil it well; when cooked, squeeze out the moisture, chop it up, and then sauté it in a pan with a lot of olive oil; cut up an onion finely and sauté it; and when the asparagus and onion are almost done frying together, add a little wine syrup or honey. The sauce is made thus: get toast that has soaked in vinegar and good spices, and add a little hot water or bouillon; when the asparagus has fried, add in the sauce and boil it all together; stir it constantly until it is off the fire and has stopped boiling."

The few other recipe translations of Mr. Grewe's in Mr. Scully's book don't reference specific spices. In the "Libro de Cozina" by

Master Rupert de Nola (1529. Translation by Vincent Cuenca.) the following are listed as common spices for sauces : cinnamon, cloves, ginger, pepper, cilantro, and saffron. So, I based my spice choices on those known to be in that region, albeit much later than 1324 (one must work with the references available, especially since I lack knowledge of the medieval Spanish and so must rely on what I can find in the translated literature.) I chose honey as opposed to wine syrup (is this actually must? Or a sugar syrup flavored with wine? This isn't clear to me at this time.)

Here is my redaction"
 3 lb. asparagus, trimmed
 water for boiling
 1 medium onion, peeled and diced
 4-6 Tbsp olive oil (may need to add even more once the onion is added.)
 1 Tbsp honey (more to your taste-correct as the sauce finishes)
 1-2 slices white bread, toasted
 1/3 C. red wine vinegar, steeped with: 1/8 tsp. each true cinnamon, ginger, and cloves.
 ½ -1 C. beef bouillon

In a medium bowl, soak the toasted bread in the spiced vinegar. Set aside.

Place the asparagus in a small stockpot, and cover with water. Bring the pot to a boil, turn down to simmer, and cook the asparagus to al dente. Remove the asparagus, drain, and squeeze them between clean dishtowels to remove as much moisture as possible. Cut the spears into one-inch pieces. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil, and add the asparagus pieces and sauté well. Stir in the onion and continue to sauté it with the asparagus, adding more oil as needed, until the asparagus is slightly browned. Stir in the honey with the asparagus and onion, lowering the heat. Take the spiced vinegar toast mixture. Add ½ C bouillon to this mixture, stir well, and then add to the skillet. Gradually turn up the heat until the sauce mixture begins to boil. If there doesn't appear to be enough liquid, add the other ½ C. of bouillon. Stir constantly. When the sauce is well blended, remove the skillet from heat, continuing to stir as long as the mixture still boils. Correct the seasoning.
 Serve hot. Serves 6-8 at a feast. Enjoy!

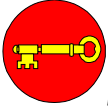

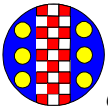

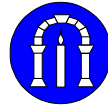
