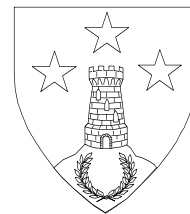

(If you can't make it, don't feel bad. You were there for him when he was alive and that's when it was important.)

This is a Jewish closure ceremony near the one-year anniversary of the death called the Unveiling of the Headstone. At this point, we are still sad, but excessive grief is questioning the Almighty. A short ceremony is at the cemetery (you don't have to be Jewish or

know Hebrew--if fact, you'll be in the majority). If you want, you may put a small stone (from Pennsic or something meaningful) on the headstone, like at the end of "Schlindler's List".

A meal/reception will be held immediately afterwards at 3712 N. Murray Ave. in Shorewood. (414) 332-6537. Before entering the house, you will ritually wash your hands, indicating that you are moving from one spiritual plane (the dead) to another (the living). From Rose Marian's Recipe Box: Canebynes with Bacon

If you're feeling adventurous, cooking wise, try period beans with bacon. Warning: the bean preparation is labor/time intensive. Not for the casual cook.

This recipe is from "A Noble Book of Cookery for a Prince's Houssholde or Any Other Estatey Houssholde" from a manuscript from the late 15th century (the original facsimile editor from 1888 postulates that it was written shortly after 1467). This facsimile was reprinted in Cariadoc and Elizabeth's cookbook collection.

From a discussion of beans on Stefan's Florigium, Adamantius defines canebynes: "Canebynes are a preparation of dry favas which consists of soaking them until they begin to swell up and almost germinate, like malt. They will split partway out of that leathery husk, and then it is easier to remove. The beans are then cut into smaller pieces (remember favas are sometimes an inch long) and toasted to help dry them."

James Matterer's "Gode Cookery" period cooking website's glossary defines them similarly.

Possibly it was done to add variety to the diet, or to make the beans cook faster later, but I didn't find that so.

Here's the original recipe:

"Canebynes with Bacon. To mak canebyns with bacon, tak and put swet broth in a pot then welsh canebyns clene and put to none other liquor but boil them up and let them be salt and serve them, and then tak fayre ribbes of bacon boled and do away the skyn and lat them in another dissche and serve them as you would frumenty and venysen."

Here's my redaction, substituting strip bacon for "fayre ribbes of bacon" as bacon isn't typically available that way, at least in this country.

Take 14 oz or so of dried fava beans (Middle Eastern specialty food shops carry them. Also try World Market or Woodmans) and soak, husk, chop, and toast them as described above. Plan ahead, this takes more time than you'd like. Soaking takes 1-2 days depending on the beans you have. Another ½ hour or so to husk them, I chopped them in the food processor (15 min), and toasted them for 1/2 hour in a 325 F oven

Take good fresh broth (I used beef broth) and place it in a pot (I used a Dutch oven.) Wash the toasted beans clean and place them in the broth to boil. Don't add anything else. Boil 45min -1 hour. While that's boiling, in another pot, boil 8 strips of bacon for about

30 minutes and drain. Keep the bacon warm. When the beans are done, drain them and salt to taste. Serve warm with the bacon on the side in another dish.

It would serve 6-8 at a feast, but I don't know that I'd serve it on a large scale due to the time/labor factor. Maybe as a dish for High Table.

Not the most impressive of dishes, but a bit interesting nevertheless. Enjoy!

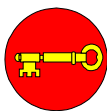

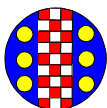
